3 hot zone, so we contribute tremendously to  
4 the community.  
5 we have experienced a great opportunity in  
6 our lives as well as our families as part  
7 of the development of projects like this  
8 one. My desire would be that a bridge  
9 like this would be developed. I support  
10 something like this, including Tri-Met or  
11 a light rail.

12 My past as an immigrant in seeing  
13 projects like this that run behind, it  
14 brings down the economy and it brings down  
15 life, people and opportunities.

16 The only thing that I am not in favor  
17 of is the process that the current  
18 Force -- or not necessarily the Task  
19 Force, but the design portion of it that  
20 has included diversity in the project.  
21 Especially being a federally funded  
22 project, there should be diversity and  
23 local people to work in the current  
24 project and not wait for the construction  
25 piece of things.

1 I also am a member of Minority  
2 Contractors and I am a national  
3 representative for that organization. And  
4 I have been asking them continuously for  
5 opportunities and they said that because  
6 Washington is taking the lead on it and  
7 not Oregon -- the other thing is that they  
8 say they are giving moneys, but it's not  
9 to be the technical piece, but the local  
10 public involvement.

11 So it's just sad for me as a minority  
12 woman that there is no representation in  
13 this especially when I -- most of my  
14 employees are 50 percent African-Americans  
15 and Hispanics.
