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FRANK MCBARRON: My name is Frank McBarron and I have -- (inaudible) -- high density and the current plan for the road to Clark College. I live at 1451 Southeast Columbia Way, one mile east here on the Columbia River.

I take light rail about twice a week to Third and Yamhill in Downtown Portland and I testify in court whether folks are disabled or not. My wife drives me to the Hood -- to the Cascade Station around eight miles and then picks me up when I am done. I testified for two hours today, went to and returned from Portland without event.

Since the gentleman was assaulted in Gresham, the cars have become remarkably safe. With my training, I easily recognize dysfunctional people. Prior to the Gresham event, I saw a lot of dysfunctional people and it's only a problem if you are agitated.

Since that event -- I've been doing this for seven years, and twice I had to intervene and that is very dangerous.

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Since then, I have seen one event of a significantly disabled person at the Rose Garden Station and that was handled by Dispatch by the Tri-Met people.

The new recommendation by the three Tri-Met commissioners are arrogant and should never have reached the media. Any of us can conjure up a better way than the recommended I-5 bridge -- then I think it is three or five, I couldn't tell which one it was -- to the Clark College area that I recommended.

I, from the beginning, however, will have turned light rail west from the Expo Station to a new railroad bridge to build new railroad bridge with the current heavy rail, light rail and anticipated TGV, a 200-plus mile-an-hour train between Portland and Vancouver BC.

The bridge would obviously make river traffic safer and better. The (inaudible) would extend to the portland airport. I think by 2050 no airplane should go between those cities. Now I would tell you it's just as arrogant for me to

00067 present that recommendation then it is for these three gentlemen from Tri-Met to present their recommendation at this late 4 date. That is just utter nonsense. My 5 idea is better than their idea and how dare they. 7 Tri-Met must include Vancouver 8 (inaudible) as soon as possible. 9 Quad-Met, as I call it, must become more 10 transparent.
