RESPONSIBLE OFFICIALS: The Federal lead agencies, Federal Highway Administration and Federal Transit Administration, in coordination with the Washington State Department of Transportation, Oregon State Department of Transportation, Southwest Washington Regional Transportation Council, Metro, C-TRAN and TriMet, and in cooperation with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, U.S. Coast Guard, Federal Aviation Administration, National Park Service, and Washington State Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation, has issued a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the Washington State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) for the following project.

PROJECT NAME: Interstate-5 Columbia River Crossing Project

LOCATION OF PROPOSAL: The Interstate-5 (I-5) Columbia River Crossing project proposes bridge, transit and highway improvements within the I-5 corridor extending from State Route 500 in Vancouver, Washington, to approximately Columbia Boulevard in Portland, Oregon.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSAL: Alternatives considered in the Draft EIS and Section 4(f) Evaluation include a No-Build alternative and four multi-modal build alternatives that either replace or rehabilitate the existing river crossing, provide highway improvements, either extend light rail or provide bus rapid transit with several transit alignment and length options, improve bicycle and pedestrian facilities, consider tolling and implement transportation system management and demand measures. The multi-modal build alternatives were designed to improve safety, capacity and mobility for highway users, transit users and bicyclists and pedestrians in the I-5 corridor.

There are two primary multi-modal river crossing options under consideration, a replacement multi-modal river crossing and a supplemental multi-modal river crossing. A replacement river crossing would include removing the existing I-5 bridges and building new bridges west of the existing I-5 bridges. Two new bridges would carry north and southbound I-5 traffic, and the third would have a high-capacity transit guideway and an exclusive path for bicycles and pedestrians. A supplemental river crossing would include a new bridge downstream of the existing I-5 crossing, and would include two lanes or tracks for high-capacity transit and four lanes of southbound Interstate traffic. The supplemental river crossing would use both existing I-5 bridges to carry four lanes of northbound I-5 traffic, bicycles, and pedestrians.

The highway improvements included with both river crossings would widen the existing I-5 alignment and provide three through lanes on I-5 in each direction from Marine Drive to SR 500, but would differ in the number of auxiliary lanes provided, and in the design of some interchanges.

The multi-modal alternatives include two transit modes—bus rapid transit or light rail. Bus rapid transit and light rail would both operate separately from other traffic, in an exclusive right-of-way on city streets or on separate structures. Each of the CRC build alternatives includes four transit terminus options—Kiggins Bowl terminus, Lincoln terminus, Clark College minimum operable segment (MOS), or Mill Plain MOS. Each of the terminus options has different alignment options for extending the guideway from the Portland Expo Center to the terminus in Vancouver.

The Draft EIS defines the alternatives, their benefits and trade-offs, and analyzes potential transportation, community and environmental effects. This analysis also considers the financial feasibility and cost-effectiveness of the alternatives.

SECTION 4(f) FINDINGS OF DE MINIMIS IMPACT: The Administration is also seeking public review and comment on proposed findings of *de minimis* impact to the public parks listed below. A *de minimis* impact is one that will not adversely affect the features, attributes or activities qualifying the property for protection under Section 4(f) (defined in 23 CFR 774.17). Findings of *de minimis* impact are anticipated for the following public parks in Vancouver, WA:

- Waterfront Renaissance Trail (realign trail under the proposed I-5 bridges)
- Waterfront Park (locate bridge piers in park; build bridge over portion of park)
- Leverich Park (acquire about one percent of park property)
- Kiggins Bowl (acquire portion of wooded area northeast of play field; realign trail located north of the play field).
