Columbia River Crossing completes milestone: Final Environmental Impact Statement released Four information sessions scheduled

Replacing the Interstate Bridge and extending light rail to Vancouver will improve safety, reduce the hours of congestion and provide more travel choices for people traveling between Portland and Vancouver, according to the analysis now available for a 30-day review.

The Columbia River Crossing (CRC) project, on behalf of the Federal Highway Administration and the Federal Transit Administration, has completed its Final Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). This milestone brings the project closer to completing the planning phase required by the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA).

This document is the culmination of years of planning and design discussions with project sponsors, stakeholders and the public. It builds on analyses included in the Draft EIS published in 2008, the comments received on the Draft EIS, and public input received at more than 950 community briefings, workshops and public meetings.

The Final EIS is available for viewing and download on the CRC website: www.columbiarivercrossing.org. This website also contains locations to view the document at Portland/Vancouver community centers and libraries, and information to request a copy.

Community members are invited to learn more about the CRC Final EIS at one of four informational drop-in sessions:

At the drop-in sessions, copies of the report will be available to read and subject matter experts will be available to answer questions.

A 30-day review period for the Final EIS concludes Oct. 24, 2011. It is anticipated that the federal oversight agencies, Federal Highway Administration and Federal Transit Administration, will select an alternative and sign a record of decision in late 2011. The record of decision signals the conclusion of the NEPA process. CRC will then continue to develop the design for the project, with construction scheduled to begin in 2013.
